

Certified Nurse Aide Course Description and Requirements

This class will teach students the skills, to care for patients of long-term care facilities by learn how to provide safety and preventive measures in the care of residents as well as how to function as a member of the health care team. Students will be prepared for entry-level employment in long-term care facilities, hospitals, and doctor's offices. This course of study prepares candidates to be become "Certified" by passing the required state certification exam. Certification fee is not included in the cost of the course.

Clinical experience required: Please initial acknowledging that it is understood that 80 hours of clinical practice is required and it is scheduled by the host facility. SJCCD will not be able to accommodate changes in clinical scheduling. Failure to complete the clinical for ANY reason will result in failure of the course and a refund will not be provided.

Prerequisites:

- According to the Texas Administrative Code Title 25 Part 1 Chapter 97 Subchapter B Rule 97.64, Students enrolled in (non-veterinary) health-related higher education related course which will involve direct patient contact with potential exposure to blood or bodily fluids in educational, medical, or dental care facilities must have all of the following vaccinations before they may engage in the course activities described.
 - a. Immunizations or titers for: Hepatitis B, MMR, Tdap (<10 years old), Varicella, Influenza (no titer and seasonal). To read more on this requirement please visit Texas Health and Human Services website at: http://bit.ly/TXimmunizations
 - b. Negative TB screen

 - a. Effective September 1, 2017, HB 1508 amends the Texas Occupations Code Section 53 that requires education providers to notify potential or enrolled students that a criminal history may make them ineligible for an occupational license upon program completion. Medical Restrictions:

□ I acknowledge the physical requirements are as follows: must be able to squat, bend and lift, or assist with 100 pounds. The student is aware that if they have a medical condition, develop a medical condition, are pregnant, become pregnant, are under medical care, or have any physically limiting condition, a medical release must be provided by the student's medical care provider. The medical release must indicate that you are cleared to squat, bend and lift, or assist with 100 pounds during your training and testing. Because the skills you may need to perform for the CNA certification exam are not known until testing day, medical restrictions may prevent you from completing the nurse aide certification skill test. See the Texas Nurse Aide Candidate Handbook for the skill requirements.

 Students who do not meet the stated physical requirements will not be able to attend clinical rotations. Clinical rotations are required to successfully complete the CNA course

The background check is conducted by PreCheck, Inc., a firm specializing in the healthcare industry.
